Background Information:

• In 2014, we joined EDB WiFi 100 scheme to enhance our WiFi infrastructure.

• A school-based e-learning curriculum, "Better English Curriculum" for Key Stage 1 students was developed with tailor-made learning and teaching materials.

School-based Phonics Curriculum

 To provide our students with the building blocks and foundational skills to learn and speak English

• We designed a school-based Phonics App, "Magic Chunking Bee" as part of our phonics curriculum to help students consolidate the foundational phonics skills in KS1.

Library Reading Curriculum

• To build up our students' reading habits and give them the skills to be independent readers, we designed a school-based Library Reading Curriculum.
